In fact, in 2018, Sarah Boxx created No Labels, No Limits, a podcast dedicated to breaking free of labels and limiting beliefs to achieve personal and professional success. Sarah shared, "This has so many meanings for me and I try to apply it to myself (personal and professional goals and dreams) and to be more generous and kind to others."

Your neighbors Sherman and Sarah Boxx met professionally while working on a cross-sector response to Missing and Exploited Children for Washoe County (part of the National Office of Juvenile Justice). Washoe was the fifth county in the nation to do this work. Sarah explained, "I was the director of the Child Assault Prevention Project at that time and Sherman was a Sergeant with Sparks PD. We served on the MCAP team as colleagues for a few years as he continued championing children and families. I became the Executive Director of the Children's Cabinet, Inc. The more I learned about Sherman, his sense of duty (to serve) and honor, along with his commitment to children and families, the more my respect grew." They started dating in 1999 and married in 2001.

Sarah became a stepparent to Sherman's two (nearly grown) children at the time. Today, Sandra Boxx, 39, is a nurse at Northern Nevada HOPES and great all-around mom to six amazing kids and lives nearby in Sparks. Steven Boxx, 37, is a Specialist with Washoe County Sheriff's Office, and a supergreat uncle to Sandy's kids.

Sarah is a lifelong entrepreneur and started at a young age. As she shared all that she's done it became clear she is a serial entrepreneur and a hard worker. "I am a lifelong learner and student. I love working and helping people succeed. My first job was addressing envelopes for a penny apiece for my dad under his desk when I was in second grade. At 12, I worked for a custom saddle maker, bottling and packaging saddle soap. I've worked in retail, warehousing, and family manufacturing. I launched and operated my wallpapering business. I began teaching women's self-defense

and empowerment in the late 80's which brought me to Reno in 1991." She paid cash for her first car, a '66 Volkswagen van. She dreamed about having a Volkswagen van and earned enough money to purchase it and pay for the insurance, much to the chagrin of her father.

In the late 80's, nonprofits and volunteering became an important part of her professional and personal life. She became a best-selling author of The Changemaker Ripple Effect in 2016. In 2020, she launched the Intentional Nonprofit Leaders Community membership, where she helps nonprofit executives who are overextended at work and home by showing them how to regain time, reduce stress, and lead strategically so they can live a life they love at work and at home. Sarah earned a Master of Art in Pastoral Counseling from St. John's University and has a mediation certification from the Neighborhood Mediation Center, Reno, Nevada.
